CPG JUDGING

There are several tools that help chapters provide the best training to its members and the best service to the community. One is the Chairman's Planning Guide, or CPG. This is essentially a business plan-type tool that helps a chairperson document the details of a project. With this documentation, the project can be easily evaluated and improved upon if it is held again. Chapters have the opportunity to submit these CPG's for judging on the state level. This helps a chairperson learn how to improve their CPG. The best CPG's are then recognized at the awards ceremony at Mid-Year and Year-End Convention. Chapters from around the state will meet at headquarters on **Saturday, January 14** for **CPG Judging**. In order for our books to be eligible for awards, we must have a judge present that day. Even if you didn't run a project or write a CPG you can volunteer to be a judge. This is a great opportunity to learn about the process!

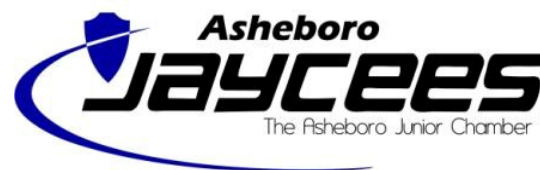
